MEET THE TEACHER PARENTS' EVENING - Our Autumn Term Parents' Evening is on **Thursday 21st September**. This initial Open Evening of the year is primarily a chance for you to get to meet your child's class teacher and be more informed about their new class routines, The topics being covered and the curriculum content. It is not a progress meeting as it is too early in the term for any assessments to have taken place. A more formal Parents Evening will take place in the Spring Term. During the evening, there will be a presentation from each class teacher as follows:

You are welcome to visit your child's class during their availability slot to chat with them and view the resources that are on display. You should find the evening informative and you will have the opportunity to wander around school to look at other

classes and meet other members of staff. This is particularly useful if your child has a different teacher for phonics or mental maths.

CAREERS WEEK - Over the week commencing the 16th October, we are going to hold a Career's Week in school for children in Years 5 and 6. This will be an opportunity to be inspired by adults in our community! HARVEST FESTIVAL - A traditional Harvest Festival in St Lawrence Church on Sunday 24th September, 10:00 to 10:50. This year children in Years 4 and 5 will take part in the service with a short presentation and prayers. The whole school is welcome to attend the service and to bring gifts of tins or packets of food. The Rose King and his retinue will be in attendance and will help to receive gifts of food items from the children as they present them at the front of church. The food is then taken to the local food bank.

HARVEST GIFTS - Children who are unable to attend the Harvest Service are welcome to bring their harvest gifts to school on **Friday 21st September**. Classes will be able to visit church during the afternoon to present their gifts.

NUTS AND GRAPES - This is a reminder that children should **not bring any nuts and grapes** in to school and if your child is bringing cherry tomatoes, then these **must be cut in half lengthways** as they are a choking hazard.

COATS - Please be reminded that coats **MUST be green or black**.

BIRTHDAYS - A reminder that children may wear non-uniform on their birthday (or the nearest day to it). This enables everyone in school to make a fuss of them on their big day! We also know children love to bring in treats for their class on their birthday and we will be able to allow this again this year however, we must insist that treats are small and individually wrapped (no birthday cake). Children can then take this home and it is the parent's decision if and when they have this.



PARENTPAY - How to set up automated email alerts on ParentPay. Log into your child's account as per your username and password then: Select - **COMMUNICATION - ALERT SETTINGS** to select how you receive any alerts. The newsletter can then go directly to your email account, along with any trip, or other information posted on ParentPay as soon as it is made live.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE - A reminder that after school activities cannot be relied upon for childcare. These clubs are often run by staff or volunteers and are sometimes cancelled at short-notice. If you know that you will require childcare after school, you should contact Mrs Greenhalgh in Stay and Play Club (Tel 01772 864953) to secure a place. The after school club list will be issued next week and places can be booked on ParentPay.

COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL - If you are concerned about any aspect of school life, please get in touch with us as soon as possible. This will help to alleviate your worries and will also give the school a chance to sort things out before they escalate. Small concerns or queries can be dealt with in person with a member of staff on duty in a morning or with your child's class teacher at the end of the school day. Children can also hand a quick note or give a verbal message to their class teacher when they arrive in class. If you would like to make an appointment for a meeting with a member of staff, either face-to-face

or by telephone, please drop a note to the class teacher or contact the school office and Louise will be happy to arrange that for you.

SCHOOL SPIDER APP -In order to receive communications from us, you must download the app and **stay logged in**. You must also accept push notifications in order to be notified when you receive a new communication. Your username is your first name and surname with no spaces e.g louisehigham. When logging on for the first time please click Forgotten password or follow the link on the separate email sent to you. **Please note where we have two parents/carers details each person will be allocated their own login details. Please do not struggle with this, just pop in to see Louise in the office!**



ONE HUNDRED CLUB - **Please help us!** As a church school, the governors have to fund 10% of the cost of any maintenance or building projects. We also have to pay VAT. These are additional costs that community schools do not need to find. Without it we cannot complete any building or development works. The Governor's 100 Club helps to raise these funds.
